A tale of two BREXITs!

Even though I am writing this in mid-January I doubt very much that by the time you read this piece the fog around BREXIT will have lifted. [I would be delighted if I were wrong!] Sadly, the huge challenge that this country has faced since the summer of 2016 had turned into a drama and now evolved into a crisis. Change is often difficult, but I think that most people in



this country feel let down by the leaders of all parties in their inability to come together to agree the best way forward for the country. Instead of focussing on what is best for the country, politicians have sought to advance their own causes and beliefs which is why we are in the predicament that we now face.

But we as a parish have also had to deal with our own BREXIT when Bron announced in the summer that she felt called by God to minister to a new parish in the north of the county. So as a parish we have had to deal with, and continue to deal with, significant change. Bron achieved a lot during the 12 years she was with us but perhaps the most telling part of her legacy is how we get on without her before a new vicar is appointed. [A great deal is being done to find her successor, so don't worry unduly!].

Whilst it is early days in many ways, and with the help of many people, we are just about managing to keep the number of services the same as before. We are able to do this with the vital and much appreciated support of a number of retired vicars led by Rev Canon Keith Turner and his wife Jane, who had been supporting Bron for a while. Not only that but all our lay leaders have stepped up significantly to meet the challenge and by the clergy and the laity coming together, and focussing on God's will, we are managing to do a good job, or so we are told by our Archdeacon!

Perhaps Westminster could learn something from the Wiverton Parish?

Probably we will be like this for quite a few more months but we are open for business as usual [as you can see from schedule of services in the centrefold] so please do continue to support your church or if you haven't been for a while then we would love to see you!


