





# The PCC .....

is looking at the possibility of appointing someone to help to help our new Rector, once he or she arrives, with all those administrative tasks that churches have to deal with these days. Whilst the job will involve attending meetings of the PCC there is much more that needs to be done to help keep the ship afloat. We anticipate it will take up 5 or 6 hours a week and will be a paid post. Historically this sort of role has been carried out by unpaid church secretaries in each of our former parishes but with the move to one parish we see the need to change things. We are still a little way off deciding on the job spec and what it will pay but we are keen to establish whether there is anyone who may be interested in the post. At this stage we are simply seeking expressions of interest. Any responses will be treated in the strictest of confidence and will help inform our thinking on this as we move it forward. # Progress towards appointing a new Rector – an update from the Parish Profile Team.

Behind the scenes, a small working party has prepared a "Parish Profile" which explains who we are, our vision for the future, the qualities we're looking for in our new rector and what we can offer in return. We hope it will inspire the right person to come and lead us forward.

The first draft of this has been broadly approved by the Parochial Church Council and, at the time off writing, is with the Associate Archdeacon for Transition Ministry and the Bishop for their final thoughts. Following that, the position will be advertised and the Parish Profile will be available to view on the Wiverton in the Vale website, www.wivertoninthevale.co.uk

We now need to pray that a suitable applicant comes forward. We have no doubt that we are an attractive place for someone who leans towards rural ministry. Whilst we are aware of the very considerable challenges the church faces in making appointments, we are optimistic. This is due in no small part to the work Bron put into the single parish project as well as the support we have had from everyone across the whole Parish since we entered interregnum - a real sign of the Holy Spirit showing the way for our new Rector. If our combined efforts lead to suitable applicants stepping forward and all goes well we would hope to have a new Rector in place later this year.

In the meantime, we are very grateful for the support we are receiving from a number of retired clergy, our Area Dean in a supervisory capacity, and the associate Archdeacon who has a particular role in guiding us through this process. With these, plus willing and experienced lay people, we are able to offer a full schedule of Sunday services and midweek events as advertised. Weddings, baptisms and funerals can still be arranged - please see the back page for contact details.
