Update on our search for a new rector

We have received a late application, which has been scrutinised by the Bishops and approved for us to follow through to an interview process.

The Crown ecclesiastical representative will be visiting the Parish on 1st July to get to get a sense of the area and context prior taking her part on the selection panel. There will be a bring and share lunch at the Old School, Cropwell Bishop at 1.00pm for Parish reps as part of this.

The interviews will take place the following week, after which it could take a few weeks before an outcome is announced. Patience will need to be exercised! It's not a foregone conclusion that this applicant will be appointed: the Parish reps will need to be confident that the appointment has the potential to move us forward as we seek to grow disciples wider, younger and deeper, and the candidate would also need to feel confident that this is the right place for them.

Please continue to hold this process, all the people involved, and the ongoing life and work of the Parish in your prayers.

If you haven't yet heard of this, it's the Bishops' Mission coming to our Diocese 12th-15th September, led by Archbishop John Sentamu supported by a full

entourage of Northern Bishops and staff. Please look out for further details about events in our Parish, Deanery and Diocese, and think about who you might invite along.

QUESTIONS OF GIVING

WHY? Practically speaking, to cover costs: the ministry, mission and ongoing maintenance of the churches in the Parish, cost over £2200 a week. As Christians, we want to play our part in this in line with Biblical teaching and in response to God's generosity to us.

HOW MUCH? The C of E asks its members to aim towards giving at least 10% of their income back to God, suggesting 5% to church and 5% to other charities. Some do, but we realise, especially in times of austerity, that this may be not be feasible and we are truly thankful for **all** your offering in money, time and skill.

DID YOU KNOW? The Church of England receives no government funding, but is able to claim Gift Aid on donations, within the terms of the scheme.

HOW CAN WE GIVE? Most of our worshippers and wider supporters give regularly by standing order. The practice of passing round an offertory plate during services raises a significant amount of additional money and is a demonstration of commitment and generosity, which visitors can join in with.
