The annual Art and Craft Fair run by the Rotary clubs of Bingham & Radcliffe and the Vale of Belvoir has moved its venue and its usual April date and will this year be held at The Blue Diamond East Bridgford Home and Garden Centre on the Saturday 6th and Sunday 7th of July. We are extremely grateful to the management for their support in letting us hold the event there at this wonderful venue.

The event will again feature the local junior school art competition which last year attracted around 200 exhibits.

Last year the event raised over £4000 for the Air Ambulance and this year we are hoping to make it a bigger event and raise money for both the Air Ambulance and local First Responder groups.

The exhibition is open to artists from a wide area who would like to exhibit their work for sale. A fee of £10 is asked for exhibiting up to 4 works of art with 15% commission on sales donated to our charities. Crafters are also able to sell their homemade wares for a small fee. As usual there will be a raffle with exciting prizes.

Operation Christmas Child

We'll be sending toy filled shoeboxes to desperately needy children again this Christmas.

For over 15 years we've worked with colleagues in Nottingham for the Operation Christmas Child project which is a part of the American based charity, *Samaritan's Purse*. This year the Nottingham group has decided to switch to a British charity called *Teams4U* (*http://teams4u.com*). There are several reasons for this, which I can explain to anyone interested, and I have decided to go with them. The restrictions on which items may be included in the boxes are slightly less stringent and the transport cost is less at £2.50. Otherwise it will be much the same.

If you would like to participate you will need a leaflet(s) with instructions, and a medium sized shoebox(es) covered with pretty paper. If you haven't got a suitable box then I can supply free flat packed shoeboxes which are easy to assemble (!). Leaflets and boxes will be in the unlocked churches in the parish for you to collect from the beginning of October and you can return the filled boxes to church any time before November 11th. Better still, you can return your boxes to the service at at Langar on November 3rd at 10.30am, where they will be blessed and prayers will be said for the children who will receive them.


