### LOCKDOWN LETTERS From the Rectory and Beyond

# **REFLECTIONS by Revd Canon Keith Turner**

Luke chapter 5 begins with two boats on the water's edge. The fishermen were washing their nets. Jesus clambers into one of the boats owned by Simon and he uses it as a 'floating pulpit'! When he has finished teaching, he asks Simon to put out into deep water and let down the nets for a catch.

All night long, they had been fishing without success. 'But', Simon says, 'because you say so, I will let down the nets'. Let's pause the story there – a tiring, fruitless night's fishing, the nets clean, now time for a rest! A fisherman listens to a carpenter about catching fish!

Simon who became known as Peter was prepared to do something he did not really want to do just because Jesus asked him. There was something about Jesus which made the suggestion worth accepting.

Perhaps we are challenged here about doing something we don't really want to do, something which upsets our routine or goes against the way we usually do things, something which seems too much like hard work or appears illogical. What does this part of the story teach us about 'accepting the advice of Jesus' in doing what we would rather not?

Today is the Accession of our Queen. Princess Elizabeth's uncle had abdicated and George had become King. Now on the death of her father, at the age of 25 while in Kenya, she would accede to the throne. I wonder whether there have been times when she would rather not have embarked on this *life of service*. When have been those times that forced her to change? When has the monarchy itself been threatened? When has it been transformed?

In this chaotic world — and as I write, the Russian invasion of Ukraine seems imminent — coping with change is a reality of life and it is often very hard. But we have a superb example in Her Majesty, in making *service* a core element in facing this. I wonder when we get irritated by change and challenge in daily life — and in Church life too! — whether we need to dwell on that word '*service*'. Do we say: "We have done that and been there and it hasn't worked; we simply don't like the idea; we've not done things like this before"? Called to *service* is to listen and to be prepared to take a risk with Christ always alongside us.

### PEW RUNNERS

The Parish of Wiverton in the Vale is blessed with 8 rare, 14<sup>th</sup> century, poppy head pews in use in St Giles, Cropwell Bishop. Unfortunately, they are neither comfortable or welcoming. While we wait in hope for a 'go-ahead' for our re-
