LOCKDOWN LETTERS From the Rectory and Beyond

Luke 14:25-33 and 15:1-10

Just before these passages, Jesus spoke about someone (God) setting up a great party and inviting great numbers of guests who all found excuses as to why they were too busy to attend. Then the host becomes angry and tells his servants to bring in the poor, the crippled, the lame and the blind and then just pull people in. And the original invitees are left out.

Not a gentle picture of God, is it? Not all soft and woolly.

His next words, in our first passage, sound pretty harsh, too. "Whoever comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, yes, even life itself, cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not carry the cross and follow me cannot be my disciple."

The word for 'hate' is a Semitic idiom that means 'love less.' So, it is to not hold something in value above something else, in other words God, Jesus, comes first. Familiar, isn't it? The very first commandment is, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind." (Matt 22:37.) And, when we do, everything is enriched with God's love flowing into us, our lives find the right balance and God lends us his strength to live the life he wants us to.

Here, he warns about the cost of declaring that we are followers of Jesus Christ. It is nothing in comparison to the cross that Jesus carried for us. But it is something we accept when we follow him. And we do not carry it alone. God is with us, helping us to shoulder our burdens and giving us his joy in the midst of

the worst hostility. Sometimes from the friends and family we hold dear. We are not promised an easy road.

In the second passage, Jesus is criticised for 'welcoming sinners' and eating with them and he tells the Pharisees the story of the shepherd's delight at rescuing his lost sheep while the other 99 are fine, and about the woman rejoicing over the finding of the lost coin. He speaks of "the joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents." He's trying to tell the Pharisees that God loves us passionately, whole heartedly and unconditionally. Whatever we've done, however terrible we think it is and we are, God's love is so huge it wipes it out and cascades over us.

God is not soft and woolly. He is immensely powerful and he loves us, his creation, despite ourselves, and he wants to rescue us. He wants us to turn to him so that we can be healed and brought home to join in his huge feast. We need to accept that invitation!

Prayer: Thank you, Lord, that you have invited us into your kingdom, that you gave us Jesus to save us and the Holy Spirit to guide us. Help us always to put you first and to trust you. Thank you for your love. **Amen.**
