LOCKDOWN LETTERS From the Rectory and Beyond

REFLECTIONS by Revd Canon Keith Turner

I had written my first letter shortly before the death of Her Majesty the Queen; that obviously had to be replaced! We are in a period of National Mourning before the State Funeral on Monday. In my own mind, I wondered whether the Harvest Service on Sunday would be appropriate, but I think it is, although this will not undermine the sense of grief and loss we feel. Her Majesty understood farming and its routine whatever happens; harvest is essential.

We shall be focussing on 'A Hungry World'. In John 6 verse 9, Andrew says: "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish? But what are they among so many people?"

I believe the Feeding was a miraculous 'sign' and not just this particular action encouraging others also to share their 'picnics' — although even that would have been incredible! But from that small gift and that one question something wonderful happened. The impact of this lad's offering seems to be about sacrificial giving and how God takes that and multiplies it.

At Harvest, we pray for the farming community here in the Parish, and this year nationally, we pray for the frightening financial impact of the energy crisis. But worldwide, we have to respond to the needs of millions of people whose harvests have failed through drought, floods and war ... and are starving. But picking up that verse about the small picnic offering, how can small donations have any effect on catastrophes beyond imagination? I believe that with God's blessing they can, and the challenge is for us to take personal 'giving' seriously, as small as it may seem.

But returning to the impact of one person, we remember the example of humble and sacrificial service of our late Queen who sought to follow the humble and sacrificial service of her Lord and Saviour. Her impact nationally and throughout the world has been utterly amazing. And surely it reminds us that each of us individually, with the grace of God, can make a difference in a world that cries out for help in one form or another.

Sometimes we feel so helpless in the face of vast problems and great need. But we are called not to be swamped by the enormity of it all, but in God's love to do what we can and see Him transform our 'gifts' beyond our imagination.
