LETTERS From the Rectory and Beyond

REFLECTIONS by Hilary Tabron

We're in the wonderful season of Harvest, a time of fruitfulness and thankfulness, and a time when we are encouraged to respond with generosity to others who are not so fortunate.

Harvest comes at a time of change, in the transition between the long bright days of summer and the shorter, colder days of winter. We hardly need it pointed out that we are in a season of change in many other ways too, with a new monarch, a new Prime Minister and plans to be made in our Parish towards the appointment of a new incumbent all in the mix. That's a lot to process, bringing additional stresses overlaid on pre-existing post-pandemic stresses and whatever additional situations or losses might be affecting us personally. How can we deal with all that?

We can take lessons from nature – God's creation. As autumn fades into winter, trees may look dead, but they are resting and protecting themselves in readiness for the season to come. But they are still rooted, held in readiness for a new season of growth in spring, when the sap rises, buds swell and leaves unfold.

And we can take lessons from His son Jesus. From Gospel narratives we read that Jesus prioritised making special time for prayer with his Father, getting alongside Him and his rhythm. We also read that, rooted in his Fathers love and power, Jesus was able to calm the wind and the sea when he and his disciples were caught in a storm. The disciples had been in fear of their lives, but Jesus, in effect, said "I've got this". Calm was restored. As our way of 'staying in the boat' we too need to prioritise time for prayer, as well as for soaking in his word through the pages of the Bible. If change and challenge threaten to overwhelm us, we can turn to Jesus and receive his peace, trusting him to say "I've got this".

We will have the opportunity to do that collectively when we have the Parish Refresh Day on 19th November, offering time to reflect and restore, in readiness for whatever the future holds for us in this Parish. Further details are available in these notices.
