REFLECTIONS by Edward Hine

England's Green and Pleasant Land!

I guess that 'Jerusalem' is one of the most sung hymns throughout this country [and it certainly is at St John's!]

The lyrics were written by William Blake over 200 years ago and whilst it still resonates strongly now will it in another 200 years, or perhaps even in 50 years?

I understand that our Diocese has recently been awarded a Bronze medal for being Eco Friendly which is wonderful and a good example. As a parish we can strive to become greener and can try to secure a Bronze medal of our own. It is not an easy path and there are many hurdles to clear and we are currently putting together a team of our 'Green Champions' to look into this but we need more help. A year ago I tried to get a company to do a green audit on St John's but heard nothing more from them after they found out how little electricity we consume generally! There are Gold and Silver medals to be awarded but I believe these may be well beyond the scope of a rural parish like ours. Even a Bronze medal may prove to be beyond us but at least we should look at what it entails and if that is the case surely we should do whatever we can to help?

I know one of the criteria for obtaining a Bronze medal is preaching at least once a year on God's creation and how mankind can best preserve and protect it. Well Sid ticked that box on Sunday and his excellent sermon is the inspiration for this piece. What else can we do? Are we sourcing Fair Trade goods for our churches? Are we sourcing power from renewable sources? Should not one of our bimonthly charities be one which combats climate change. Will whatever we do have a significant effect on global warming? Of course not but it sets a good example to everyone in our villages and hopefully will get these issues into the mainstream of conversation and concern in our communities. But every little bit helps so it is important that we all do our bit!

PRAYERS

O God, we pray for justice and fairness for those worst hit by our changing climate. We know people living in extreme poverty around the world are worst hit by the climate crisis but have done the least to contribute to it. They also have the fewest resources to implement change.
