LETTERS From the Rectory and Beyond

REFLECTIONS by Peter Hills

True Fasting, Isaiah 58 verses 1 to 9a

In Chapter 58 Isaiah does not hold back in attacking the ritualism of the Jewish people as they return from exile. His words were probably first uttered during the building of the second temple about 520-515 BC. The people were fasting at least twice a year in the hope of seeking God's guidance and answers to their current troubles; Isaiah was not impressed.

I wonder if fasting is something you have tried and if so, I wonder what your motivation was. In this passage we join Isaiah as he challenges the people in the way they have gone about their fasting. According to Isaiah their approach and attitude is not right. Their hearts are not right with God. In verses 3 and 4 it is evident that the people have a 'we do this and you will respond' approach to God; as Isaiah points out this is not what is required. Indeed, Isaiah says that even on the days they are fasting 'you do as you please and exploit all your workers.' Isaiah is directing the people to a fast not from food but from affluence, indifference and privilege (verses 6 and 7). And then we read those wonderful words (v8 and 9) that suggest in such beautiful language just how God will respond if the people and indeed **we** approach fasting in the right way:

'you will call and the Lord will answer'

'your light will break forth like the dawn.'

And 'you will cry for help and he will say. Here I am.'

Like Isaiah, Jesus similarly warns against false spirituality. He says our prayer and fasting should be done not as a public show but 'when you fast put oil on your head and wash your face......and your Father, who sees what is done in secret will reward you'. Matthew 6 v 17-18.


In my limited experience of fasting I would suggest that fasting is a way to prepare ourselves to pray more in line with God's will. It can provide a way of drawing closer to God, listening more acutely to His voice, to feeling His love and to seeking His direction for our lives.

There are many wise words written about fasting but I would stress the need for undertaking it with very gradual severity, focussing upon God and only when your health will not be compromised.

If we approach it wisely then as we read in Isaiah 'your righteousness will go before you and the glory of the Lord will be your rear guard.' Verse 8b
