LETTERS From the Rectory and Beyond

REFLECTIONS by Vivien Hall

My favourite words in the Bible are, unsurprisingly, said by Jesus. "Our Father", - just two words but both loaded with meaning!

"Our" is such an inclusive word and to appreciate that, it helps to think about what Jesus didn't say. He didn't say "My" which would have excluded us from being, together with him, the children of God. He didn't say "Your" which again would have separated him from us. He certainly didn't say "Belonging to only those who are Jews, or Very Good People or even, Baptised People". No, Jesus chose "Our", which anyone can say who wants to.

"Father", (or another translation, "Abba"), is a very intimate word. Again, looking at what Jesus didn't say, helps to appreciate it. He didn't say, "Creator of the universe", nor "Almighty King of Heaven", both of which would have been correct, but awe-inspiring and remote.

Human fathers are all flawed, some more than others. For those people who have experienced the worst sort, the word "Father" has painful associations. Feminists, the fatherless and others might also have problems with the word. Nevertheless, most people worldwide, in Jesus' time right up to the present day, have a good understanding of the qualities that describe a perfect father. So "Father" is a great way of conveying all the qualities in just one word. They include being responsible, faithful, wise, having authority, but above all having supreme unconditional, forgiving love. What a marvellous privilege we have because Jesus told us to use these two words!
