LETTERS From the Rectory and Beyond

REFLECTIONS by Katharine Bacon

John has two great stories for us over this fortnight. Nicodemus, visiting Jesus at night to find out more about him, and the woman at the well in the Samaritan village. In neither does Jesus speak to them as they would expect.

Nicodemus expected respect. He was a high-ranking Pharisee and he had come specially to see Jesus, by night, admittedly, so that he would not be seen by anyone else. He wanted to test him out. But Jesus seemed to be speaking gobbledegook. What was this about being born again? Impossible! And then Jesus explains about the Holy Spirit and teases him about not knowing this despite being so learned! Nicodemus has said he recognises God's at work in Jesus's miracles but he doesn't recognise the Son of God when he's stood right in front of him. His own status as a wise man and leader blinds him.

Then the woman at the well is sparky. She almost flirts with Jesus and ducks and dives away from his questions and statements. But then he tells her who he is and she runs away. She runs away when it gets too personal and it's all about her, and him. She runs away but then she tells the other Samaritans about him and asks that question, "He can't be the messiah, can he?" It's almost as if she doesn't trust herself to make that judgement.

How often do we duck and dive away from the intimacy of a deeper relationship with God? Are we prepared to have those conversations with him? Can we let him scrutinise our lives? Or do we tiptoe back into the night, deeply puzzled and disgruntled, or run away when it gets personal?

Lent is a perfect time to let God come deeper into our lives, let him start those conversations and let our souls respond. This is a time to give God centre space and wait and see what happens.
