#### **REFLECTIONS by Hilary Tabron**

I visited a friend this week, and she pointed out a new sofa, which she said had seemed to shine and sparkle in the bright sunlit showroom. She went on to say that once home in a north-facing room, this perfectly fine sofa seemed dull. Later on, I found myself thinking that we all thrive, and even shine, in the light of loving relationships, and glow when we are appreciated.

Isn't it wonderful, therefore, that we have a special day to remember, give thanks for and take special care of mothers, who were the ones who helped us to know we are loved, and the ones who are juggling so many pressures with young families, and still are able to surround their children with love.

But among the cards, the flowers and the chocolates, there's a tension too. We can't air-brush out the recognition that for some people this day will be difficult. Many will be keenly feeling the loss of a loved mum today; others may be struggling desperately with parenthood; some are far away or estranged from parent or child, and others have not grown up within a family, or have not had children of their own. Yet whatever our circumstances there are always things to be thankful for. Let's value and nurture the relationships we have.

And let's nurture our relationship with God. Starting the day with prayer is a way of deliberately turning our attention to him, allowing the light of his love to shine on us, and opening the way for us to then reflect this light to others. That's as true for our families as for our neighbours, friends and anyone we might come across through the day.
