REFLECTIONS by Peter Hills

Jesus Ascends into Heaven

I was 19 years old when I had my first understanding of the importance of Ascension Day in the Church's calendar. I was playing cricket for Nottingham University 2nd XI against Southwell Clergy. We had batted and set them around 150 to win. Their early batsman had been dismissed but they were on course for victory. A message came from beyond the boundary that some of the clergy who had been dismissed were leaving. The time was approaching 5.30pm. We carried on playing for another 20 minutes or so before another wicket fell and the game just stopped. The remaining Clergy decided that time was up and they needed to be on their way to take the evening Ascension Day services! The sportsman in me was not happy but what this event did make me do was to consider what Ascension Day was all about.

As the name suggests, Ascension Day marks the day Jesus ascended into heaven, having spent the 40 days after his resurrection travelling with his disciples. Therefore, it always falls on the sixth Thursday after Easter, exactly 40 days after Easter Sunday. Our reading suggests that the disciples who watch him disappear are understandably awestruck. Two men in white robes appear, angels, who proceed to rebuke the disciples: "Why are you standing there staring stupidly at the sky?" They were puzzled, what was going on? Just as the disciples are puzzled so may we be too. As John Henry Newman puts it, "This, indeed, is our state at present; we have lost Christ and we have found Him; we see Him not, yet we discern Him." But he goes on, the ascension of Christ "is a sure token that heaven is a certain fixed place." However strange a picture, however stupidly it causes us to stare at the sky, Christ's promise to prepare a place for us means nothing less than this: a future life where all will be revealed and we shall be welcomed in.

As a nation we may not apparently celebrate Ascension Day in such an outward manner as is done in many other European countries, Germany in particular, where there is a national holiday and the men of the nation get together to enjoy a drink or more but perhaps this year we can take time to invite God to teach us what we should understand from Ascension Day. A thoughtful reading of Acts 1 verses 1 to 11 might be a good place to start.
