LETTERS From the Rectory and Beyond

REFLECTIONS by Peter Hills

I am a retired mathematics teacher; a job I loved and found so fulfilling, involving numerous interactions and one in which you could clearly see student progress being made day by day.

It has been said that Socrates and Aristotle each taught for 40 years, Plato for 50 years but Jesus for only three. Yet His influence far surpasses the combined 130 years of teaching by these men who are acknowledged as the greatest philosophers of all antiquity. He painted no pictures, yet the finest paintings of Raphael, Michelangelos and Leonardo da Vinci received their illumination from Him. He wrote no poetry, yet Dante, Milton and other great poets were inspired by Him. He composed no music, yet Haydn, Handel, Beethoven and Bach reached their highest perfection in hymns, symphonies and oratorios composed in His honour. Jesus is quite simply the greatest teacher who ever lived.

In today's passage Jesus and his disciples have reached Caesarea, interestingly an area where pagan Gods were worshipped. Jesus is patiently teaching them and slowly but surely their understanding is growing. Here Jesus asks "Who do people say the Son of Man is?"

And Peter's response "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God."

God put those words into Peter's mind and mouth, but they were a product of Peter's faith and reflection. And we too have to answer the same question, "Who do YOU say I am?"

We also have to answer it in a world which is often hostile to Christianity. We can't just coast on our faith, for it is not merely something handed down to us. Our answer will not be made in words or church doctrine. It will be made by how we live, by who we are.

Jesus goes on to tell Peter he will be the foundation, the rock, upon which He will build the Church. 'The Church' being the people, and not buildings or properties. Christians thrived in the first and second century, under persecution, where they met secretly in small, informal home settings. The church is God's church, and we have to build it the way he wants us to build it. As the rock of the church, Peter and the disciples had to make decisions that would not please everyone. Church leaders today still have to make decisions that do not please everyone.

Soon we shall welcome David and Pixie to the Parish, under their guidance may the Church be built in the way God wishes it go.
