### LETTERS From the Rectory and Beyond

#### **REFLECTIONS by Katharine Bacon**

In the passage from Matthew, we see Peter having a horrible time. He plummets from such a high point of having called Jesus "the Christ, Son of the living God" (16:16) and being praised by Jesus and told he will be the rock on which Jesus will build the church and he'll have the keys to heaven.

All that rushes straight to his head — as it might any of us — and he feels he has a right to rebuke Jesus when he tells the disciples that he must suffer and die at Jerusalem to rise again. "God forbid, Lord!" (16:22). And then Jesus' words, "Get behind me, Satan!" Devastating! But look at Jesus, fully human, fully divine. The temptation to step aside from God's path, so attractive, so alluring, laid before him by the disciple he has called the rock, one of his closest disciples.

And it would be so easy. Forget the rejection, the dishonour, the excruciating pain, the separation from God, the death. Accept the human way that would simply lead to more violence and death.

But no, God's upside down way leads to life, is the only route to life. To quote Jane Williams, "Really, we do know this. We have only to look around at the history of a world governed by a different definition of power, and we see that rulers are replaced by other rulers, that the governors die, just like the governed. No one can get their own way by force all the time. God's life is the only real and lasting life that there is and he wishes to share it with us."

We know that Peter did come to understand this and it is thanks to him and so many other Christians that we have a church family that helps us, step by step, to move closer to God as we follow Jesus.
