14th September - Ride and Stride, support our churches and riders and striders raising money.




6th October – Salt and Light, 5.00pm at St Andrew's, Langar.

LETTERS From the Rectory and Beyond

REFLECTIONS by Revd Canon Keith Turner

By the time you read this, it will all be over! The General Election will have taken place and the leader of the successful Party asked by the King to form a Government. And so the history of our nation moves on, and we as Christians, however we voted, have that vital role to continue practising our faith, sharing the Gospel and praying for those in authority.

While living in the present and looking to the future, the past and the history which has shaped us are incredibly important. 6th June marked 80 years since D-Day, the largest seaborne invasion in history, and the beginning of the liberation of Western Europe. The words 'Lest we forget' are so worth pondering.

I have been reading two very different books about remembering, but ever so strangely there is a link between them. Currently I am enjoying 'Egypt' by Joyce Tyldesley (which accompanied the BBC TV series *Egypt* in 2005), and before that 'The Eucharist in Four Dimensions' by Jessica Martin. The Jewish Passover (Seder) has its roots in the Exodus and freedom from slavery in Egypt, and the Eucharist is rooted in the Passover as Jesus gave us the Last Supper. What continuity!

In the present, we are faced with so much uncertainty, and yes, possibly great fear and depression. What will happen if....? What will happen if we don't get a grip on damage to the environment? What will be the effect of AI ... ? Will Parliament agree to 'assisted suicide'? And so the list goes on.

But every Sunday at Holy Communion, we remember Jesus' death and resurrection for us. In Bread and Wine we are renewed and encouraged as year follows year and we are reassured of God's love, presence and hope.

The last three lines of the Invitation say this: 'Eat and drink in remembrance that he died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith with thanksgiving.'" As we wonder how things will be, here in this Freedom Meal we are fed and encouraged to journey on with hope.

And so, however, we feel about 'the way things are' or about politics and politicians generally, and failures in integrity, judgment and truthfulness, we must never lose heart. We have a much greater freedom to experience and to share for which perhaps the nation unwittingly craves. We have a vital responsibility to pray.

A Prayer from Common Worship

Almighty God, the fountain of all goodness, bless our Sovereign Lord, King Charles, and all who are in authority under him: that they may order all things in wisdom and equity, righteousness and peace, to the honour of your name, and the good of your Church and people, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen
